River View (3-1) — the reigning Eastern Washington Athletic Conference East champion closing its third Class 2B state appearance in a row after denying the Coyotes such a trip in an EWAC crossover contest in 2021 at Handing Field — got the better of Kittitas/Thorp for the third time in four years after the Coyotes' 24-21 win last fall in Finley.

Kittitas/Thorp, intent to "hit hard" each time it breaks huddle, heads next to Cle Elum-Roslyn (0-4 after a 28-0 loss to No. 18 Tri-Cities Prep Friday at Chiavanna High School in Pasco) for a cross-county clash some call the "Battle of Elk Heights" scheduled for 7 p.m. Friday, Sept. 29.

The Coyotes visit Chuck Allen Field for the first time in the four-year EWAC West rivalry. Cle Elum-Roslyn won 21-0 in 2020 before Kittitas/Thorp answered 21-7 in 2021 and 55-16 and in 2022.

ELLENSBURG 3B, GRANDVIEW 0

The Ellensburg High School football team sealed its second shutout in as many weeks, its second clean sheet against Grandview in 364 days and its fourth goose egg in 378 days Friday in Grandview.

Colton Magruder rushed for over 100 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Isaac Stueckle returned one of his two interceptions for a score, and Darius Andaya reached the end zone once.

The Bulldogs (2-2 overall, 2-0 Central Washington Athletic Conference) followed up on their 39-0 Sept. 22, 2022, home blowout of the Greyhounds (4-2, 0-2), and have won all four meetings by a 32-57.5 average since 2020.

Next tip for the Bulldogs is a chance to beat No. 22 Prosser (2-2, 1-0) after a 27-25 loss Friday at No. 18 Aberdeen for the first time in its last seven years, scheduled for 7 p.m. Friday, Sept. 29, at Andrew J. Field in Ellensburg.

NO. 7 WASHINGTON (4-0)
Next: at Arizona, Saturday.
Reality check: If it feels as if the Huskies are leading 31-6 in the second quarter every week — as they were against Cal — it is because they sort of are. Washington has outscored opponents 130-27 in the first half.

NO. 8 SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA (4-0)
Next: at Colorado, Saturday.
Reality check: The defense is better. It really is. The Trojans rank 61st in the country in yards per play allowed after being 124th last year. Still, they are 102nd in plays of 20 yards or more allowed. Missed tackles and breakdowns are still an issue.

NO. 9 OREGON (4-0)
Next: at Stanford, Saturday.
Reality check: The Ducks have the best combination of offensive and defensive lines in the Pac-12.

NO. 10 UTAH (4-0)
Next: at No. 19 Oregon State, Friday.
Reality check: For all the great work the Utes have done without QB Cam Rising, it's now to the point where it is reasonable to

wonder how much he will be able to boost the offense when he does return.

NO. 11 NOTRE DAME (4-1)
Next: at No. 17 Duke, Saturday.
Reality check: Having 10 players on the field to defend the deciding plays vs. Ohio State was inexcusable, and there were a couple of other game-management decisions down the stretch that coach Marcus Freeman probably wants back. The Irish might be good enough for the gulfs not to define this season.

NO. 12 ALABAMA (3-1)
Next: at Mississippi State, Saturday.
Reality check: Look around at the rest of the SEC West and then ask yourself why the Crimson Tide won't win the division.

NO. 13 LSU (3-1)
Next: at No. 20 Mississippi, Saturday.
Reality check: WR Brian Thomas Jr. already has surpassed his season high with 413 yards receiving, giving the Tigers a formidable complement to star Malik Nabers.

NO. 14 OKLAHOMA (4-0)
Next: vs. Iowa State, Saturday.

Reality check: The Sooners' defense has yet to allow an opponent more than 50 yards per play in a game. It's been a lot better than last year, but probably should withhold judgment until OU plays Texas in two weeks.

NO. 15 NORTH CAROLINA (4-0)
Next: vs. Syracuse, Oct. 7.
Reality check: Even with Clemson's early stumbles, there is the makings of an interesting ACC race developing as the Tar Heels continue to play solid defense to go along with an elite offense led by QB Drake Maye. Don't assume this is Florida State's conference.

NO. 16 WASHINGTON STATE (4-0)
Next: at UCLA, Oct. 7.
Reality check: Huskies' trio of star receivers gets a lot of attention, but the Cougars' combo of Lincoln Victor and Josh Kelly is impressive, too, with eight combined touchdowns.

NO. 17 DUKE (4-0)
Next: vs. No. 11 Notre Dame, Saturday.
Reality check: The Blue Devils are not just off to one of the best starts in program history they are burying opponents. Duke is tied for seventh in the country in margin of victory at 26.3 points per

game, just behind Georgia (26.7).

NO. 18 MIAMI (4-0)
Next: vs. Georgia Tech, Oct. 7.
Reality check: Proclaiming the Hurricanes back has burned folks before. No reason to go there, but this team might be the low-key really good. Oct. 14 at North Carolina will be interesting.

NO. 19 OREGON STATE (3-1)
Next: vs. No. 10 Utah, Friday.
Reality check: Benders got blitzed by Cameron Ward and Wazoo and then threw their way back to respectability. That rebuilt secondary that looked solid through three weeks might have a hard time holding up to Pac-12 level passing games. Then again, that's a challenge for most teams.

NO. 20 MISSISSIPPI (3-1)
Next: vs. No. 13 LSU, Saturday.
Reality check: The Alabama game had not-not-now-when left to it for Lane Kiffin's Hebeles. Ole Miss might not be ranked much longer.

NO. 21 TENNESSEE (3-1)
Next: vs. South Carolina, Saturday.
Reality check: The Vols have taken care of business in their nonconference, which isn't

meaningless. They'll need to do more than that to wash off that Florida loss.

NO. 22 FLORIDA (3-1)
Next: at Kentucky, Saturday.
Reality check: After years of dominance in the rivalry, the Kentucky game has become a barometer for the Gators. Which way this season he's going.

NO. 23 MISSOURI (4-0)
Next: at Vanderbilt, Saturday.
Reality check: Welcome to the Luther Burden III breakout season. The second-year former five-star receiver has topped 100 yards on the field three games, including 10 catches for 177 yards against Memphis.

Next: at No. 3 Texas, Saturday.
Reality check: Jayhawks are better than last season, when their 4-0 start felt fortunate. Defense is still well behind the offense, but it isn't terrible like last year's version.

NOTICE IS HEREBY given that William Hendrix, landowner, and Les Seifert, authorized agent, submitted a Setback Variance application on September 8, 2023, pursuant to Kittitas County Code 17.84, on 0.34 acres of land zoned Rural Recreation with a Rural Recreation land use designation. The proposal requests a 7.5-foot reduction from the 15-foot side lot line setback for the construction of a garage and expansion of the existing home. The 15-foot side lot line setback requirements come from KCC 17.30.050. If the variance is approved, it would result in a 7.5-foot side lot line structural setback for the proposed expansion and garage, respectively. The subject property is parcel # S42034 (Lot 1, Block E, of Pine Loch Sun #1) located off E. Lakodale Dr., approximately 0.04 miles east from the intersection of SR 903 and Pine Loch Sun Dr. The property is in Section 02, Township 20, Range 14 in Kittitas County. All comments will be considered in the decision-making process, and any person has the right to comment on this application and receive notification of the Community Development Services administrative decision, once made. A Notice of Decision will be published once a decision is made. Appeals to an administrative land use decision must be filed within 10 working days with Community Development Services as outlined in Chapter 15A.07 of the Kittitas County Code. The current appeal fee is \$1670, however, you are encouraged to verify the fee amount prior to filing an appeal.
